### **Fall Issue of *Charleston Home* Magazine Highlights Upcoming *Charleston Home Market***

In "Living Luxe" (page 128), a Rutledge Avenue Victorian is redressed in rich fabrics and high style by interior designer Muffie Faith. Taking design trouble-shooting to new heights, Faith addresses a common mistake Charleston homeowners tend to make: overcompensating for high ceilings with over-sized furnishings.

Pumpkins are fall's darling ingredient and take front and center in the feature "In Praise of Pumpkins," (page 142) accompanied by tips on using the famed autumn crop for inventive craft projects (learn how to monogram your pumpkins) and recipes (find a delicious recipe for pumpkin pancakes with cinnamon-sugar mascarpone, along with warm pumpkin soup and pumpkin-walnut bread pudding). And there are more savory fall recipes in this issue of *Charleston Home*; you'll also find easy picnic dishes like chicken and pancetta sandwiches with homemade fig jam and sweet potato salad ("An Alfresco Feast," page 87).
